The company handed over more than 90 gifts to the two foundations.

Members of various sites workforces’ rose to the “Packaging for a good cause” challenge, fulfilling the wishes of people whose lives have been impacted by mental health, addiction, and other issues. Both foundations support people with a wide range of services that are tailored to the different stages of life and the needs of the individual.
